Lincoln High School is a landmark in Montgomery County black educational history. Opened in 1935, it is the oldest remaining high school constructed for black students in Montgomery County. At the time of its construction, it was the only secondary school for black students. The brick building has a decorative stone surround at the entrance, and stone lintels and sills at the 6/6 double-hung windows. There is a frame addition at the rear. As additional space was needed for classrooms and storage, six prefabricated Quonset buildings of corrugated metal were installed at the east end of the site.
