#### WHY WE HELP

##### Giving Helps Our Neighbors in Need.

While many Rockville residents enjoy a high standard of living, there are still pockets of need throughout the city. The income of more than 5,000 Rockville households is less than half of the city's median income. More than 4,600 city residents experience chronic food insecurity and 1 in 16 children live in poverty, with 3,100 students in Rockville schools qualifying for free and reduced-price meals. In 2021, 1,086 children were referred to the city for holiday assistance.

The Holiday Drive helps many of these children and families have a happier holiday season.

##### Giving Sets a Good Example for Others.

When you volunteer or donate, your friends, family and neighbors may be inspired to do the same. Giving also sets a great example for children, promoting empathy and providing an opportunity to teach them about, and involve them in, community service.

##### Giving Connects You to Your Community.

Volunteers with the Rockville Holiday Drive meet other volunteers, city staff and, in the case of some volunteers, recipients of Holiday Drive donations. Volunteers deliver food and gift donations to recipients in Rockville neighbor-

#### DID YOU KNOW?...

- 7.6% (roughly 5,000) of city residents and 8.2% (roughly 900) of Rockville seniors are living in poverty.
- About a **quarter of students** in Rockville-area schools are enrolled in the Free and Reduced-Price Meals (FARMS) program.
- The FARMS **rate has increased** over the past 10 years at 12 of 14 Montgomery County Public Schools in the Rockville area.
- Nearly 70% of the student population at one Rockville elementary school receives free and reduced-price meals, indicating that there are neighborhoods with higher concentrations of low-income households in Rockville.

#### HOW YOU HELPED IN 2021

##### Donations/Volunteers

- The Holiday Drive had no volunteers in 2021 due to the need for social distancing.
- \$77,352 (\$25,383 in online dona-

tions) was contributed to the 2021 Rockville Holiday Drive, and used to purchase food, toys and gift cards.

- \$1,680 value in gift card donations.
- \$16,880 value in donations for books and family sponsorship (toys for children up to 17 years old).

##### In November 2021:

- 618 households, including 1,950 people (184 seniors), received \$50 Giant Food gift cards.

##### In December 2021:

- 1,086 children received \$25 Target gift card and two books each for children up to 17 years old.
- 42 families (208 individuals) were sponsored in the family-sponsorship program.
- Seniors were served through the Rockville Senior Center with assistance from the county's Department of Health and Human Services.

# Housing and Community Development Department Has Wide Array of Programs and Services

## MPDU Rental Program — Rental and Homeownership Programs

The MPDU program requires a percentage set-aside of all new residential developments as moderately priced dwelling units. The program has generated about 900 rental units and 420 homeownership units throughout the city since 1990.

## Rockville Emergency Assistance Program

Emergency assistance is available for Rockville residents who are experiencing financial crisis, eviction, or utility shut-off, suffering from a natural disaster, or need a referral to food and medical resources.

Program applicants will have received court notices for failure to pay rent or utility disconnect notice. This program is the last resort to avert eviction or utility shut-off. Residents seeking emergency financial assistance must first have applied to the Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services – Services to End and Prevent Homelessness unit for a written referral to be provided to the City of Rockville.

## Bridge Rental Assistance Program

The Rockville Bridge Rental Assistance Program provides one-time financial assistance to eligible Rockville residents in need of assistance due to loss of employment or other temporary emergencies. BRIDGE aims to prevent eviction proceedings as residents pursue efforts to regain financial stability. The program also provides intensive case-management services aimed at achieving long-term self-sufficiency.

## Home Energy Assistance Program

The Home Energy Assistance Program offers one-time financial assistance that supplements local and statewide residential energy programs of up to \$5,000 for utility efficiency retrofits. HEAP funds can be leveraged with Community Development Block Grant funding to expand the scope of rehabilitation services that a household may need.

## CDBG — Multifamily and Single-Family/Owner-Occupied Rehabilitation

Each year, Rockville receives federal Community Development Block Grant funds through a cooperative agreement with Montgomery County. CDBG funds must be used for housing and community development projects that primarily benefit low- and moderate-income people or neighborhoods. The city receives about \$260,000 in CDBG funding annually and funds two programs — multifamily and single-family rehabilitation. These programs seek to correct code deficiencies, rather than make other property improvements.

## Landlord-Tenant Affairs

The city's landlord-tenant service informs the public of the general rights and responsibilities of tenants and landlords, and helps to resolve disputes amicably, free of charge, without having to go through the District Court process. The service aims to provide residents and landlords as much information as possible to help navigate landlord-tenant relationships as efficiently as possible.

## Community Mediation

The city's community mediation program is designed to assist in resolving conflicts. Mediation is a process in which individuals, groups or organizations in conflict try (with the help of mediators) to reach a mutually acceptable agreement that will resolve their dispute.

## Latino Youth Development Program

The Latino Youth Development Program seeks to engage middle and high school-age Latino males in the academic process by combining personal relationships and sports with weekly mentoring that emphasizes individual responsibility in both school and extracurricular activities. Discussions at these meetings reinforce healthy behaviors while raising awareness of the consequences of substance abuse, teen pregnancy, school suspension and dropout. Pro-

gram staff facilitate speakers to discuss preventive topics such as alcohol and substance use and abuse, team building, career orientation, nutrition, financial and coping skills. The outreach worker also provides human service resources that provide financial assistance, housing emergency food, child care, health care, help navigating the county school system and other services. Participating youth must qualify for free and reduced-price meals.

## Mentoring

In partnership with local elementary schools, the city's mentoring program coordinates volunteers to mentor students in kindergarten through fifth grade. The volunteer mentor meets at the school for one hour each week to work on study skills with an assigned child, play educational games and, most importantly, share a caring relationship. Programs are available at three elementary schools: Twinbrook, Meadow Hall and Beall.

## Summer Enrichment Program

The Summer Enrichment program seeks to address the academic retention loss that occurs during the summer months. The program supports underperforming and failing students and helps them reach academic expectations in school. It focuses on educational foundations while having fun.

The Summer Enrichment program is available through the same participating schools as the Mentoring program.

## Linkages to Learning

The Linkages to Learning Program is a collaborative effort between Montgomery County Public Schools, the Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services and local community partners to provide social and mental health services to low-income elementary and middle school children. The program's broad mission is to provide school-based wraparound services that improve the wellbeing of children and their families by addressing the social, economic, health and emotional issues

that act as a barrier to academic success. Rockville operates a Linkages to Learning Program for the city's Maryvale Elementary School students.

## Parent Education

In partnership with area providers, the city offers eight-week parenting classes. This series emphasizes the prevention of harsh physical discipline and child abuse through education in child development, realistic expectations settings and positive parenting.

## Counseling Services

The city's licensed counseling staff provide counseling services to young people and their families in need of early intervention mental health treatment. Community Services offers both formal counseling, which involves short-term meetings with a staff member for a specified period, and informal counseling, whereby youth can drop by informally to speak with the counselor. City staff works with families to address a variety of complex issues through coordination with other local agencies and programs.

## Financial Empowerment Program

The city offers financial literacy and life skills and coaching to low- and moderate-income Rockville students and residents, to meet educational needs across age demographics. The program is consistent with other local jurisdictions, and it supplements Montgomery County Services to End and Prevent Homelessness programs and Montgomery County Public Schools curriculum.

## Supportive Services

Educational seminars are available for city residents on financial and housing issues, including money management and locating affordable housing.

## Information and Referral

The city helps locate human service resources that provide financial assistance, housing and temporary shelter, emergency food, childcare, treatment for drug and alcohol abuse, health care and other services.
