

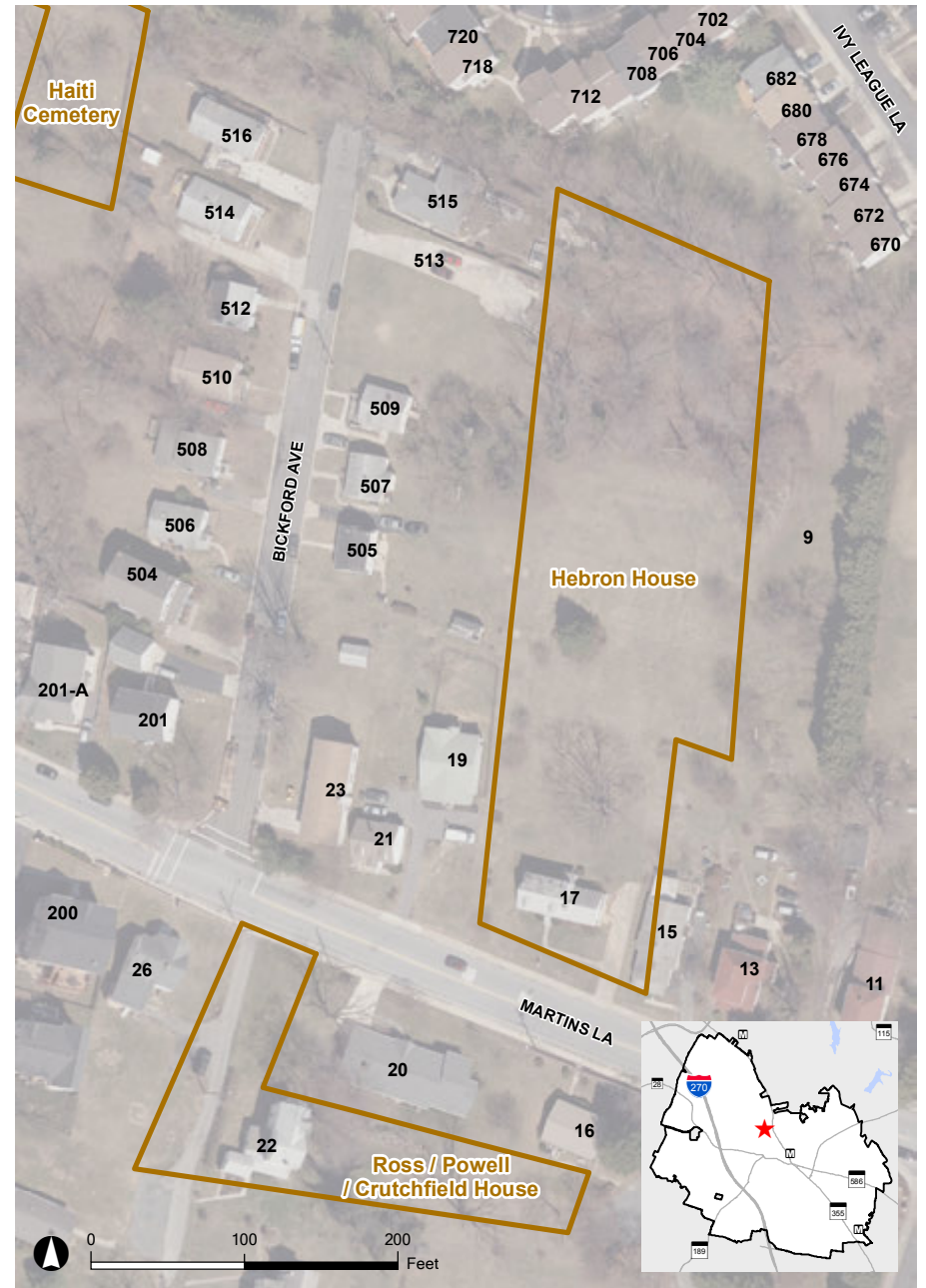

17 Martins Lane



The cultural significance of the Haiti/Martins Lane neighborhood as an African American kinship community has been recognized in recent decades through historical publications and newspaper articles, formal local designation of several of the oldest buildings, and informal local recognition of additional late nineteenth and early twentieth-century dwellings in Rockville's Historic Buildings Catalog. The importance of the community has been reinforced by the 2003 determination by the Maryland Historical Trust (MHT) that the district is eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP).

The property at 17 Martins Lane is representative of the historical and physical development of the Haiti/Martins Lane community and of the forward progress of its residents and African Americans since emancipation. While not as old as nearby structures, 17 Martins Lane reflects an important piece of the story of Haiti/Martins Lane, a neighborhood with multi-generational significance spanning two centuries.
