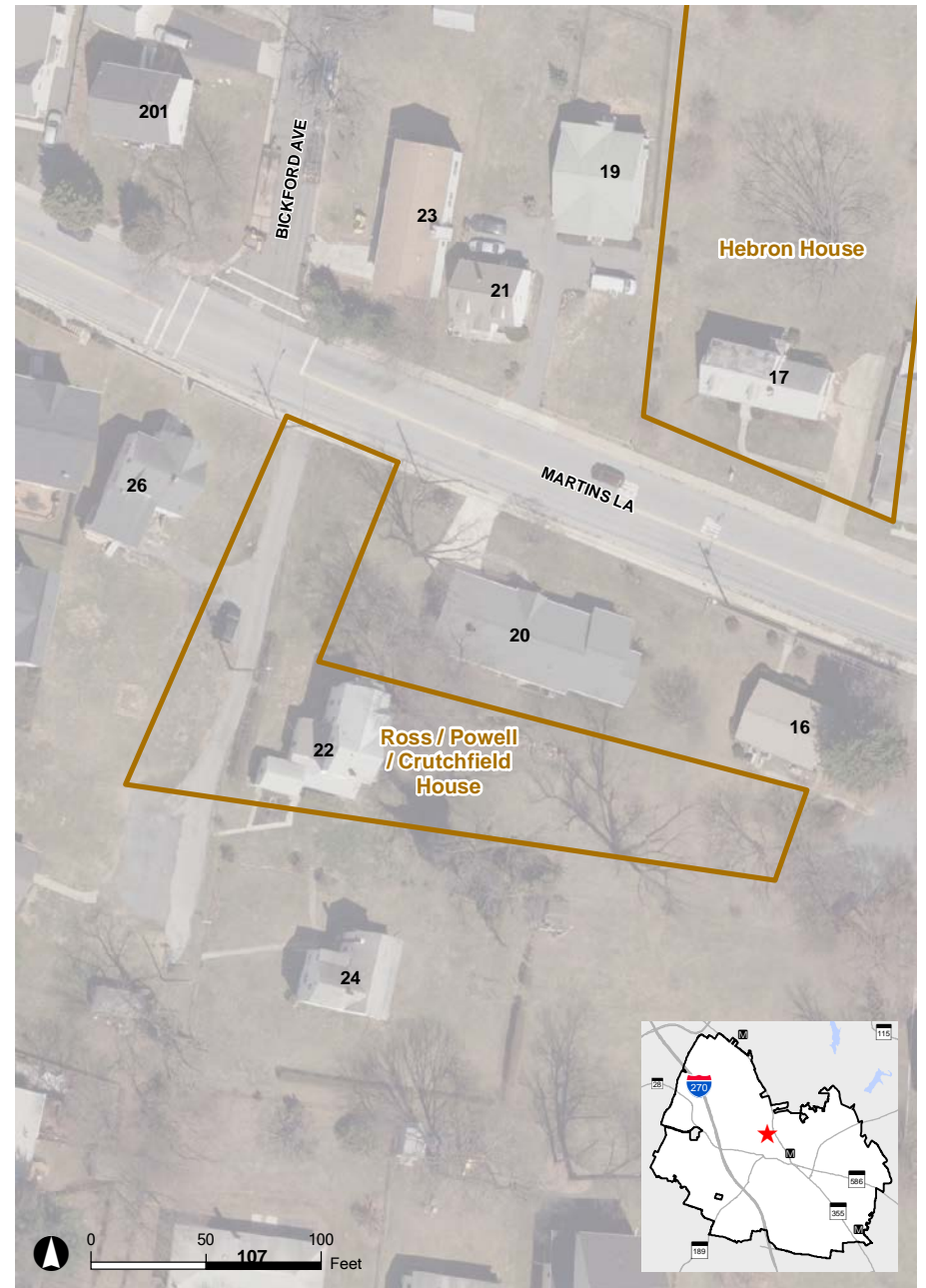


Ross-Powell-Crutchfield House

22 Martin's Lane



The Ross-Powell-Crutchfield House is associated with five generations of African-Americans living in the Haiti community. Centered around Martin's Lane, this community was settled as early as 1825, first by free blacks and then by freed slaves. The log portion of the house likely dates to ca. 1860 and was built by Alfred and Jane Carroll Ross. The house has grown and changed through the years, but continues to represent cultural ties within Rockville.
