Statement of priorities and vision for the City of Rockville

- ❶ Maintain an appropriate balance between:

 - 2) Preserving fiscal responsibility via a balanced budget.

- ❻ The City staff being the primary providers of City services and programs; emphasize continued training, development and appreciation so that these employees continue to perform in the superior manner that citizens expect and may, at times, take for granted.
