## Police Crime Report

For the Week Ending – July 7, 2019

The Rockville City Police Department would like to provide residents with some **crime prevention theft from auto tips**:

- Remove all valuables from your vehicles (to include: GPS, iPods, chargers, EZ-passes, purses and wallets, etc.).
- Remove your keys from the ignition.
- Lock your car. Take your keys and/or key fob with you.
- Secure your vehicle and set your vehicle's alarm when you exit it at all times.
- Do not hide or store spare keys or fobs in your vehicle.
- Make sure your windows have been rolled up completely and sunroof is closed before securing your vehicle.
- Park in well-lighted areas.
- When parking in attended lots or parking garages, leave only the ignition key with the attendant. (Many vehicles have a "valet" key, which limits the areas in your vehicle that can be accessed.)
- Park as close as possible to an open business.
- If you have a garage, use it.
- Close and lock your garage.
- Many vehicles come with alarms that sound only if the vehicle door is opened when the alarm has been set. Consider upgrading your vehicle's alarm with a system that responds to glass breakage.
- Please contact the Police immediately if your vehicle has been broken into or tampered with – **DO NOT TOUCH THE VEHICLE – THIS WILL CONTAMINATE THE SCENE AND PREVENT OFFICERS FROM OBTAINING ANY POSSIBLE EVIDENCE.**

### City Police Reported Incidents

A weekly Crime Report of serious incidents is provided by the Rockville City Police Department to serve as an overview of incidents occurring within the City Limits of Rockville. Please note this summary does not reflect every reported incident that has occurred. Also, the words "arrested" and "charged" do not imply guilt.

### ARRESTS

On 07/02/19, a male, age 36, was arrested for possession of a handgun in a vehicle, following an incident that occurred in the unit block of West Montgomery Avenue.

On 07/05/19, a male, age 28, was arrested for disorderly conduct, following an incident that occurred in the 1300 block of Rockville Pike.

On 07/06/19, a male, age 35, was arrested for violating a protection order, following an incident that occurred in the 100 block of Calvert Road.

## INCIDENTS

2500 block of Lindley Terrace, the complainant reported that an unknown subject removed a purse from a locked vehicle between 7:30 p.m. and 9:30 p.m. on 07/02/19.

100 block of Ladyshire Lane, the complainant reported that an unknown subject removed an unlocked vehicle from a parking garage between 3:39 a.m. and 3:41 a.m. on 07/03/19. It should be noted that a key to the vehicle was left inside. *A review of a nearby surveillance video shows the suspect described as:*

**B/M – Last Seen Wearing: black ski mask, black jeans, black jacket**

400 block of Reading Avenue, the complainant reported that an unknown subject removed a backpack containing a wallet, baby care products, and U.S. currency, from an unlocked vehicle between 7:30 a.m. on 07/03/19 and 8:15 a.m. on 07/04/19.

2000 block of Gaither Road, an unknown subject gained entry into a business by forcing open a door between 9:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. on 07/04/19. Once inside the suspect removed a pair of yoga pants from a delivery package, then exited the building. *The suspect is described as:*

**B/M, thin build, bald/shaved head – Last Seen Wearing: green tank top, blue skinny jeans, gray shoes with white soles, blue duffel style backpack**

1800 block of Rockville Pike, the complainant reported that an unknown subject removed a bookbag containing clothing and a laptop from a vehicle between 12:00 p.m. and 2:05 p.m. on 07/04/19.

600 block of Hungerford Drive, the complainant reported that an unknown subject entered the business between 7:55 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. on 07/05/19. The suspect filled a shopping cart with miscellaneous grocery items. The suspect went to the self-checkout counter and scanned the items but fail to pay for them. The suspect then left the store. *The suspect is described as:*

**B/F, short, heavy build – Last Seen Wearing: black stretch pants, black tank top, tan hat**

Unit block of Taft Court, the complainants reported that an unknown subject removed two wallets between 4:00 a.m. and 9:25 a.m. on 07/06/19.

5700 block of Denfield Road, the complainant reported that an unknown subject removed a vehicle between 1:30 p.m. on 07/06/19 and 5:40 a.m. on 07/07/19.

1600 block of Rockville Pike, the complainant reported that an unknown subject removed an unattended purse containing a cell phone and U.S. currency, that had been left in a dressing room between 5:35 p.m. and 5:45 p.m. on 07/07/19.
