October is National Crime Prevention Month! The Rockville City Police Department is committed to protecting and serving the citizens of Rockville and its visitors. As part of national crime prevention month, the Rockville City Police Department is providing citizens with tips that can reduce your chances of becoming a victim of a crime, and ways that you can help police in making Rockville a safer city for everyone.

Preventing Crime in the Workplace

- Keep your purse, wallet, keys or other valuable items with you at all times or locked in a drawer or closet.
- If you bring personal items to work, such as a coffee pot, radio, or a calculator, mark them with your name or initials and an identification number (NOTE: never use your social security number; your driver's license number is best).
- Check the identity of any strangers – keep them in public areas. Don't allow them to use non-public restrooms and phones.
- Keep all business checkbooks, cash, deposit tickets and credit cards locked in a secure area when not in use.
- Record all serial numbers of your business office equipment.
- Secure computer equipment with cable locks or other security device.
- Maintain good key and access card control.
- If you notice a malfunctioning door, alarm system, security camera, or an access security system, report the problem immediately to a supervisor, building management or security personnel as soon as possible. Do not assume that someone else has already reported it
- Greet people who enter your business, personal contact can deter crimes.

Rockville City Police Reported Incidents

The Rockville City Police Department provides a weekly Crime Report of serious incidents to serve as an overview of police activity occurring within the City Limits of Rockville. Please note this summary does not include every reported incident that has occurred during this time frame.

It is to be noted that the words “arrested” and “charged” do not imply guilt.

ARRESTS

On 10/2/19, a male, age 45, was arrested for first degree assault and aggravated assault with a firearm following an incident that occurred in the 900 block of Paulsboro Road.

On 10/3/19, a male, age 37, was arrested for driving under the influence following an incident that occurred at the intersection of East Gude Drive and Dover Road.

On 10/3/19, a male, age 28, was arrested for driving under the influence following an incident that occurred southbound on I-270 at Exit 8.

On 10/4/19, following an incident that occurred at the intersection of Norbeck Road and Baltimore Road, a request was submitted to the Montgomery County Police Department’s Special Victims Investigations Division for 3 juveniles to be charged with the theft of a motor vehicle. A male, age 18, was also arrested for theft of a motor vehicle related to this incident.

Unit block Maryland Avenue, the complainant reports that an unknown subject removed a Nintendo game console from a residence between 9/1/19 and 10/1/19. Report Received 10/1/19.

300 block Elmcroft Boulevard, the complainant reports that an unknown subject removed a backpack from the outside of a residence on 9/28/19. Report received 10/4/19.

1000 block First Street, the complainant reports an unknown subject removed gift cards from an unlocked motor vehicle between 11:30 p.m. on 10/1/19 and 4:30 p.m. on 10/2/19.

800 block First Street, the complainant reports two suspects forcefully removed property from the complainant following a meetup to buy a PlayStation 4 that was arranged online on 10/2/19. **The suspects are described as:**

#1 – H/M – Approx. age 18-20 – Slender build – Last seen wearing: blue jeans, white t-shirt

#2 - B/M - Approx. age 18-20 - Slender build - Last seen wearing: red pants, white sneakers, and gray shirt with the letters "Y & R" on the front

200 block Park Road, the complainant reports that two unknown subjects removed a cash drawer from a lottery machine at 3:42 a.m. on 10/2/19. **The suspects are described as:**

#1 - B/M - Last seen wearing a dark skull cap, dark blue hoodie, gray ripped pants with dark stripes down the side, and green/white athletic shoes

#2 - B/M - Last seen wearing black/blue zip up hoodie, half green and half black jogger pants with a solid white stripe down the side, and New Balance shoes


