- How might implicit bias manifest in police and in community members?
- What can individuals and agencies do to promote bias-free behavior? Participants will learn skills for reducing and managing bias.
- What is RCPD doing to promote fair and impartial policing?

Preventing Theft from Motor Vehicles

The Rockville City Police Department would like to remind residents how to protect themselves from becoming a victim of theft from motor vehicles.

- **Lock your vehicle!** – The majority of theft from motor vehicles reported to Rockville City Police Department are from residents leaving their vehicles unlocked. Locking your vehicle is the easiest way to protect yourself from potential thieves.
- Make sure all windows and sunroofs are closed
- Remove All Valuables from your Vehicle (i.e. Cell Phones, GPS units, Purses, Wallets, Coins) or store valuables out of sight such as in a glove box or trunk.
- If your motor vehicle will be parked for an extended period of time, remove all personal items and periodically check the vehicle.
- Remove any keys stored inside or near the vehicle
- Park in well-lit areas
- If you notice your car has been tampered with or broken into, **Call the Police Immediately**
 - **Do Not Touch The Vehicle – This will contaminate the crime scene and prevent officers from obtaining any evidence.**
