- How might implicit bias manifest in police and in community members?
- What can individuals and agencies do to promote bias-free behavior? Participants will learn skills for reducing and managing bias.
- What is RCPD doing to promote fair and impartial policing?

Effective on July 31, 2020, the Governor of Maryland expanded the current face covering order to require all Marylanders over the age of five to wear a face mask in all indoor public spaces of all businesses in the State of Maryland. It is to be noted that the words “arrested” and “charged” do not imply guilt.
