Neighborhood Safety Tips

The Rockville City Police Department would like to provide some Neighborhood Safety Tips for parents to help keep your family and neighborhood safe:

Know where your children are.

Have your children tell you or ask permission before leaving the house and give them a time to check in or be home. Have a phone number of where your child will be, should you need to reach them.

Get to know your children's friends.

Meet the parents before letting your children go to their home and keep a list of the parents' phone numbers. If you cannot personally meet the parents, then call and talk to them.

Help children learn important phone numbers.

Have your children memorize their home phone number and address; your work and cell phone numbers. If your child has trouble memorizing these, then write them down on a card and have them carry it at all times. Always tell your children where you will be, and which is the best way for them to reach you.

Set limits on where your children can go in your neighborhood.

Are there certain homes in the neighborhood you do not want your children to go to? Do you want them to cross busy roads? Are they allowed to play in vacant buildings or alleys?

Choose and discuss safe locations in your neighborhood.

Point out places they can go for help, like stores, libraries and police stations.

Teach your children not to talk to strangers.

Children should be taught not to talk to, accept gifts, or accept rides from strangers. Tell them that if they see a suspicious person, they should tell a trusted adult immediately.

Work together with your neighbors.

Watch out for suspicious and unusual behavior in your neighborhood. Get to know your neighbors and their children. Call police immediately if you see anything suspicious.

Rockville City Police Reported Incidents

The Rockville City Police Department provides a weekly Crime Report of serious incidents to serve as an overview of police activity occurring within the City Limits of Rockville. Please note this summary does not include every reported incident that has occurred during this time frame.

It is to be noted that the words “arrested” and “charged” do not imply guilt.

ARRESTS

08/18/20, a female, age 19, was arrested for driving under the influence following an incident that occurred in the 400 block of Hungerford Drive.

08/18/20, a male, age 57, was arrested for first degree assault, disorderly conduct, and obstructing and hindering following an incident that occurred in the 100 block of Rollins Avenue.
