Weekly Public Safety Information

The United States Department of Homeland Security – Federal Emergency Management Agency has designated September as National Preparedness Month. The Rockville City Police Department is doing its part to make sure you and your family stay informed and prepared for any emergency that may occur.

The Cost of Disasters

- Disasters are expensive! You may need to evacuate or relocate temporarily in the event of a disaster, and this may mean unexpected expenses such as food, lodging, and gas. According to the Federal Reserve, 40% of Americans have less than \$400 in savings. Take steps today to plan for emergencies!
- Make sure you take photographs of important documents and valuables; this will make filing insurance claims much easier in the event you need to. Record the serial numbers of all electronic devices.
- Did you know that most homeowners' and renters' insurance policies don't cover flooding? It takes 30 days for most flood insurance policies to take effect. Don't wait until it's too late!

Make an Emergency Plan

- Be prepared and make an emergency plan with you and your family. It is important to include children in the disaster planning process. Go over your plans with them so that even if you are not present, they are prepared as well.
- Designate a place where members of your family should meet in the event you are separated. You can designate a place such as a trusted neighbor's home or local community landmark. This way if you are separated in the process of evacuating you know where you can find each other.
- If you have medical equipment that requires electricity, make sure to contact your local utility companies to ensure you are on a "priority reconnection list" in the event that utility services are disrupted.
- Learn how to disconnect utilities such as natural gas and water supplies in the home.
- Make sure that you are prepared for any potential utility disruptions by having enough food, water, and medications for at least 72 hours.
- Stay informed! You can sign up for local emergency alert systems that will notify you of local watches and warnings. These systems can warn you of developing situations that can keep you prepared.
