Weekly Crime Prevention Information

As Montgomery County Public Schools prepare to return to in-person learning, the Rockville City Police Department would like to provide pedestrian safety advice to residents and back to school safety advice to students.

Back to School Diving Safety:

- Follow all speed limit restrictions. Be aware of school zone speed limit restrictions that are in effect at certain times of the day.
- Obey crossing guards
- **STOP** when a bus is engaging their flashing lights and when a school bus extends its “stop” sign.
- **WATCH OUT FOR CHILDREN.** Children may dart out into the roadway unexpectedly, especially near crosswalks, school zones, and bus stops. It is your responsibility to remain alert when driving. Observing traffic laws saves lives.

Back to School Student Safety:

- Plan a walking route for your child to and from the school or their bus stop before school starts. Accompany your child and practice this route with them. Try and choose a direct route that will be monitored by crossing guards. Avoid planning a route that leads through isolated areas such as parks, parking lots, and alleyways.
- Teach your child about the dangers of talking to strangers who approach them, including accepting gifts or rides from strangers.
- If your child will be walking or biking home from school, teach them designated “safe places/safe houses” such as a trusted neighbor’s home, a store, etc. that they can go to if they feel they are in danger.
- Have your child walk to and from school and/or bus stops with a sibling, friend, or trusted neighbor.
- Teach your child to obey traffic laws and use crosswalks if they will be walking, biking, or riding the bus to and from school.
- If your child is riding a bicycle to school, make sure they always wear a helmet and not to wear loose fitting clothing that could get caught in the chain or pedals of the bicycle.
- Make sure that your child knows his/her home phone number and address, as well as their parents work or cell phone number, a trusted family member or friend’s phone number and how to call 9-1-1.

Rockville City Police Reported Incidents

ARRESTS
