BUY SMART & DON'T FALL FOR FAKE PRODUCTS

The [National Crime Prevention Council](#) reminds you and your children that counterfeit goods are damaging and dangerous. In addition to funding criminal enterprises, counterfeit scams drain the economy, cost Americans real jobs, hurt businesses, dupe consumers, and cause over 70 deaths and 350,000 serious injuries every year.

Counterfeit goods will be cheap imitations of brand we trust. Spot fake products online with these easy tips:

Does the **grammar and vocabulary sound correct** in the product description?

Is the price ridiculously low? And is the sales tax calculated and shown? Fake products may have suspiciously low prices that may not include sales tax.

Are the **product reviews realistic**, or do they sound 'too good to be true'?

Are there high-quality product images? Fake products may use stock photos widely available online.

Is the product **coming from a sketchy address?**
