# POLICE CRIME REPORT

## ARE YOUR HOME LOCKS UP-TO-SNUFF?

---

You already know you should always lock your home, but one can be forgiven for thinking all locks offer the same level of protection. They don't.

When purchasing or upgrading locks, consider key control, physical strength, and durability:

**Key control: is your key protected against unauthorized duplication?** High-security keys are patent-protected to secure against tampering. Low-security keys have no legal protection, even if they're stamped "Do not duplicate".

**Physical strength: will the lock protect against physical abuse and does the strike-plate have 2-3 screws?**

**Durability: Grade 1-rated locks can protect you for up to 11 years** with 10 lock/unlock cycles per day.
