POLICE CRIME REPORT

YOU CAN'T HAVE PUBLIC SAFETY WITHOUT PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

The [National Crime Prevention Council](#) reminds us that while no one wants to feel unsafe in the place they call home, but you can easily limit opportunities for violent crime by getting to know your neighbors.

Why are some communities safer than others? [Research shows](#) a key ingredient is “**social cohesion**” – do residents appreciate and know their community, if they know and trust their neighbors, spend time with fellow residents, and maintain civic and public “roots”.

This social “glue” produces a kind of informal social control (that criminologists call “collective efficacy”) that enforced a standard of acceptable behavior that keeps opportunities for crime away like weedkiller to weeds.

ARRESTS
