Unit block of Courthouse Square, video shows a lone subject shatter a business's storefront window at 5:53 a.m. on 10/05/22.

Unit block of N. Washington Street, a customer to a business became angry and then flipped a display case and cash register at 2:30 p.m. on 10/06/22. **The subject is described as:**

Black male – thin-build, 5 foot 5 inches tall, 150 lbs, black hair, with a mustache – Last seen wearing blue jeans and an orange jacket

Intersection of Fleet Street & Richard Montgomery Drive, the complainant found that someone had shattered a car window and took a bag left inside between 7:30 a.m. and 11:15 a.m. on 10/06/22.
