

Resolution No. 4-99

RESOLUTION: To establish a Citizen Bicycle Advisory Committee

WHEREAS, on October 12, 1998, the Mayor and Council adopted Ordinance No. 12-98 approving the Bikeway Master Plan as an amendment to the Master Plan for the City of Rockville; and

WHEREAS, said Bikeway Master Plan recommends that a Citizen Bicycle Advisory committee be established by the Mayor and Council to maintain a direct line of communication between the City's customers and the agencies charged with responding to the community needs; and to act as a forum for developing consensus on priorities for improving conditions for bicycling and finding specific solutions for identified problems, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council are desirous of establishing the Citizen Bicycle Advisory Committee as recommended in the Bikeway Master Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF ROCKVILLE, MARYLAND, as follows:

1. There is hereby established a Citizen Bicycle Advisory Committee to consist of no more than twenty members.

2. The Citizen Bicycle Advisory Committee shall have the following duties:

A. Assist in the development of the City's bicycle and pedestrian specific policies, as well as other policies that affect the conditions for bicycling in the City;

B. Oversee the implementation of the City's Bikeway Master Plan, and report progress toward completion,

C. Review current and proposed CIP projects to ensure bicycle needs are incorporated into design and construction when appropriate; and

D. Deliver updates on the needs and desires of bicyclists in the community, with recommendations for action.
