That a City of Rockville Senior Citizen Commission he and it is hereby established, said Commission to consist of five members to be appointed by the Mayor with the confirmation of the Council. Said members shall serve for terms of two years. A Chairman of the Commission shall be appointed annually by the Mayor. Initial terms of two members of the Commission shall be for one year, and terms of three members shall be for two years, to provide for overlapping of terms; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,

That the Senior Citizen Commission shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

1. To conduct research into the problems of the senior population in Rockville, and to determine the extent of facilities and services now available to them;
