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Census Results for the City of Rockville Comprehensive Master Plan

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Introduction

Purpose

This document provides information regarding demographic, housing, social and economic conditions in the City of Rockville by compiling and presenting data released from the United States Census Bureau. The purposes of this document are to provide the general public with an understanding of existing conditions in Rockville and to assist the City government in making informed decisions about service delivery, capital improvements and planning.

Background and Sources

The primary sources for this document are from the 2010 Decennial Census and the American Community Survey (2005-2009 5-year estimates). All data is accessible from the U.S. Census Bureau web site at www.Census.gov

Before 2010, the Decennial Census included two forms: the “short form” which was sent to every household to fulfill the constitutional requirement to conduct the Census every ten years; and the “long form” which was sent to a sampling of households to collect detailed economic, social, housing and demographic data on individuals and households. Beginning with the 2010 Census, the Decennial Census includes only the “short form” survey questions through which it collects six basic demographic and housing characteristics: population, race, age, Hispanic or Latino origin, housing occupancy (occupied or vacant), and housing tenure (owned or rented). Detailed characteristics are now collected through the American Community Survey (ACS).

The American Community Survey (ACS) is a nationwide continuous survey of about three million households annually, conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, designed to provide communities a fresh look at how they are changing. The ACS collects a wide variety of information, including age, race, income, commute time to work, home value, and other data from the U.S. population.

This document uses Decennial Census figures, collected every decade on April 1st, and the ACS five-year estimates based on data collected between January 1, 2005 and December 31, 2009. Five-year estimates are available for every state, county, city, town, place, American Indian Area, Alaska Native Area, and Hawaiian Home Land, as well as for census tracts and block groups. Because this dataset reflects a five-year period, it cannot be compared directly with Decennial Census data or with the one- or three-year ACS datasets. ACS data also have larger margins of error than the Decennial Census, due to smaller sample size, particularly at geographic levels smaller than the jurisdiction, such as census blocks and tracts. The data from the 2005-2009 ACS series was the first 5-year data to be released for Rockville. For this reason, and because it was released in similar time frame as the Decennial Census, this document includes the 2005-2009 ACS data. The January 1, 2006 to December 31, 2010 five year estimates were released in December of 2012, and the data will be incorporated in future Rockville documents.

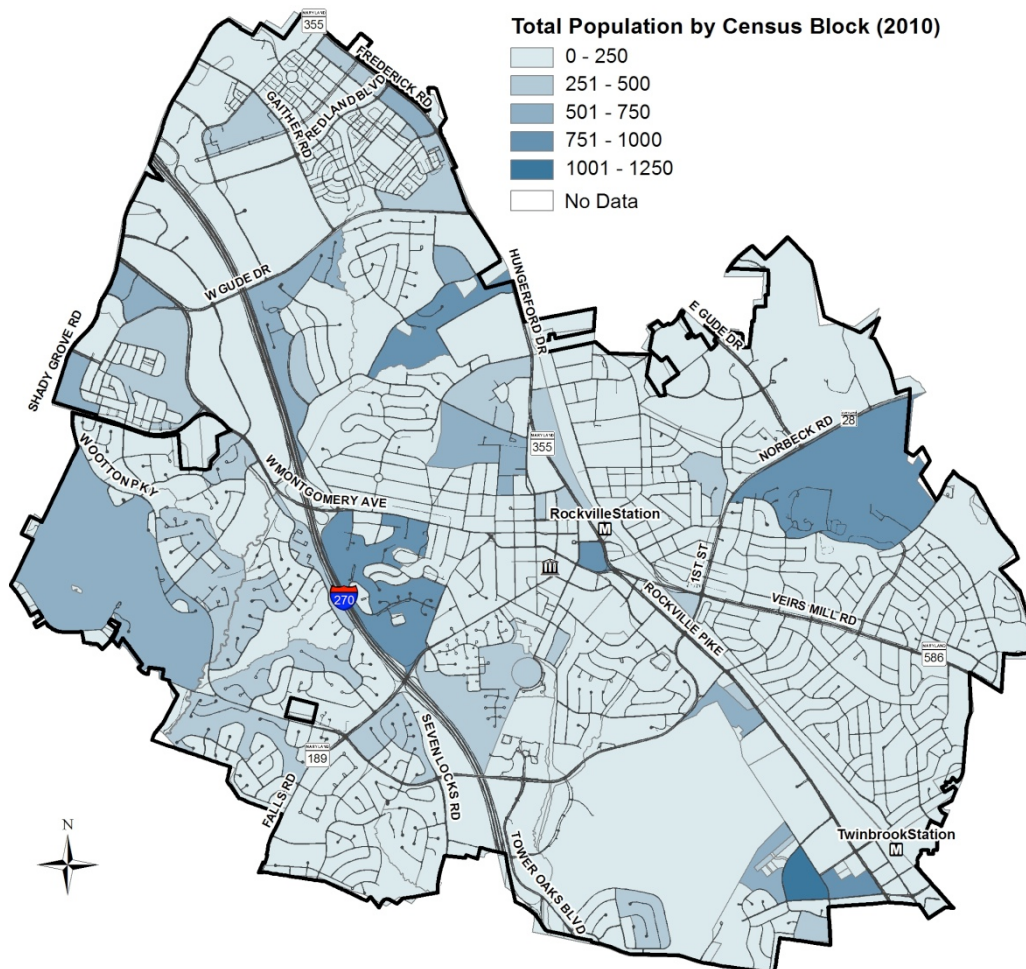

Population

Rockville's population grew by 29.2% over the last decade.

On April 1, 2010, the population of the City of Rockville totaled 61,209 people.

Figure 1: Rockville Population by Census Blocks

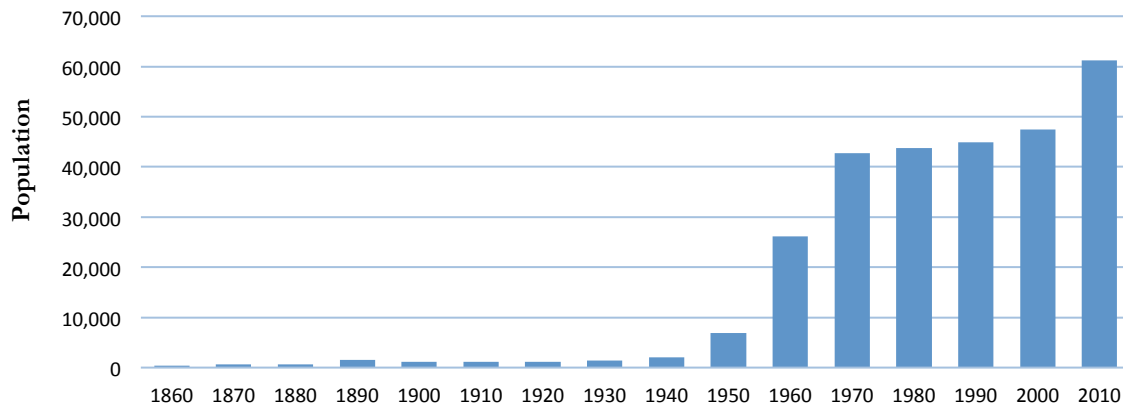

Data for the State of Maryland shows that the five most populous incorporated places and their 2010 Census counts were: Baltimore city, 620,961; Frederick, 65,239; Rockville, 61,209; Gaithersburg 59,933; and Bowie, 54,727.

The largest county in Maryland was Montgomery County with a population of 971,777 in 2010. The other top five counties included Prince George's County (863,420), Baltimore County (805,029), Anne Arundel County (537,656) and Howard County (287,085). (Note: Baltimore city and Baltimore County are separate entities and the city is not included in the county's population.)

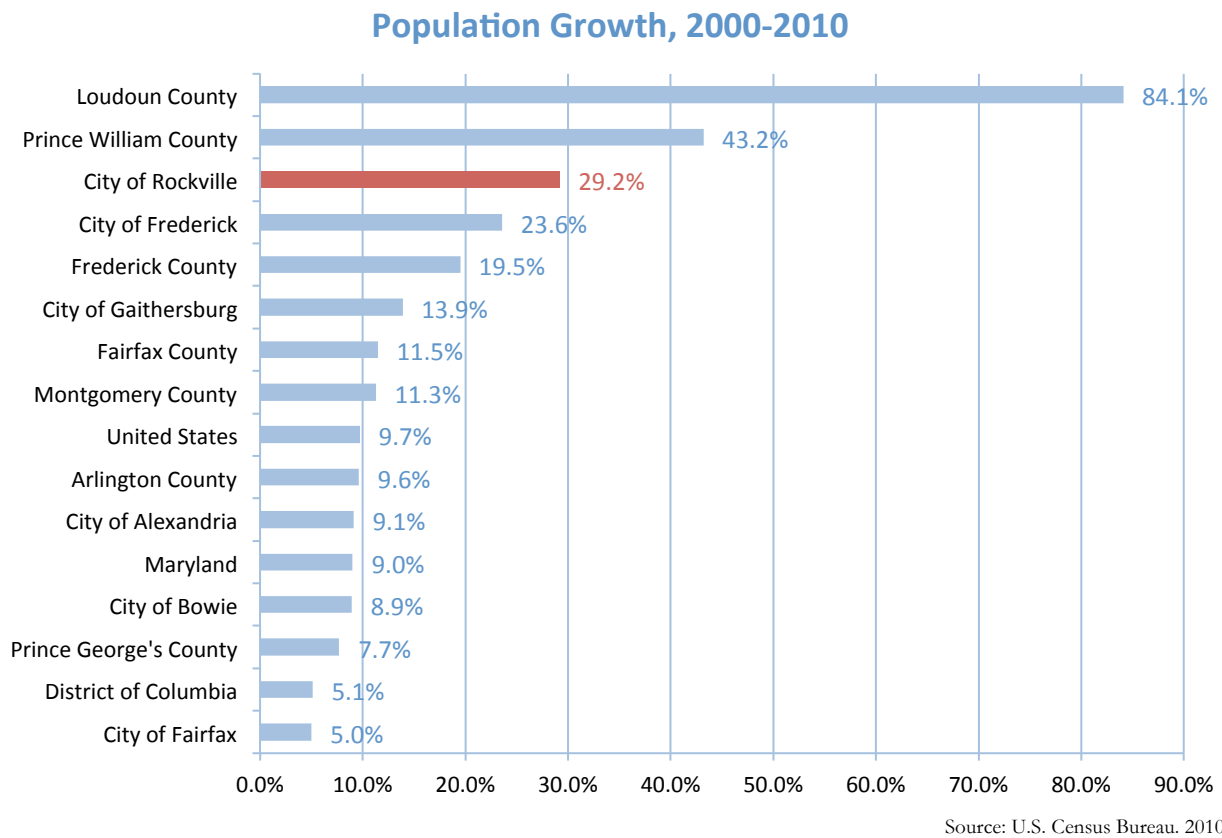

Rockville was one of the fastest growing jurisdictions in the region over the past decade and its population grew 29.2 percent from 2000 to 2010.

Population grew on land previously annexed

During the 2000-2010 decade, Rockville's population grew by 29.2 percent with little increase in land area, thereby causing its population density to increase. The majority of population growth came from the developments of King Farm and Fallsgrove, whose land had been annexed in the 1990's. Recent mixed use developments that include multifamily housing, such as Congressional South and Town Square, also increased Rockville's population and density since 2000.

Race, Ethnicity and Diversity

Rockville residents of Asian descent were the largest racial minority in the city as of 2010, at 20.6 percent. The Asian population grew from its 2000 proportion of 14.8 percent. Black or African American Rockville residents comprised the second largest racial minority at 9.6 percent of the total population in 2010. (Hispanic or Latino is not considered a “Race” by the US Census Bureau).

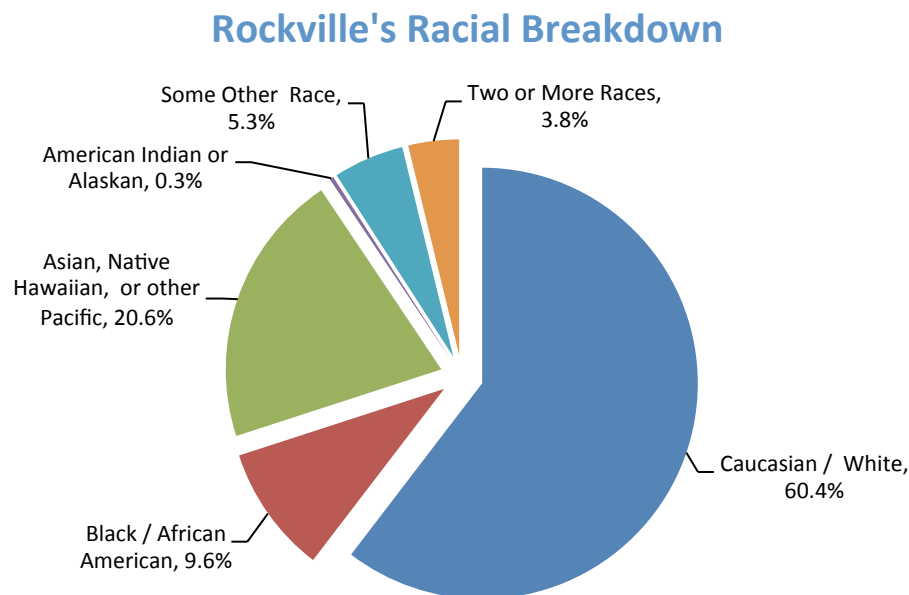

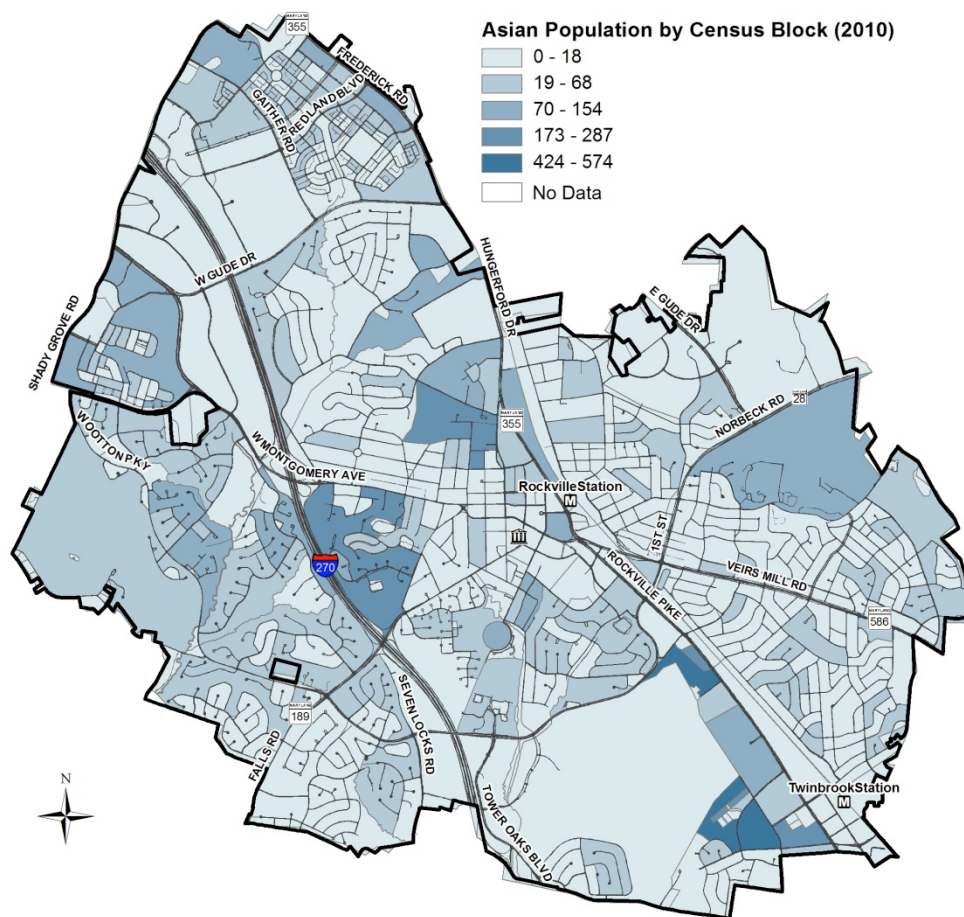

Rockville's Hispanic or Latino population grew over the past decade

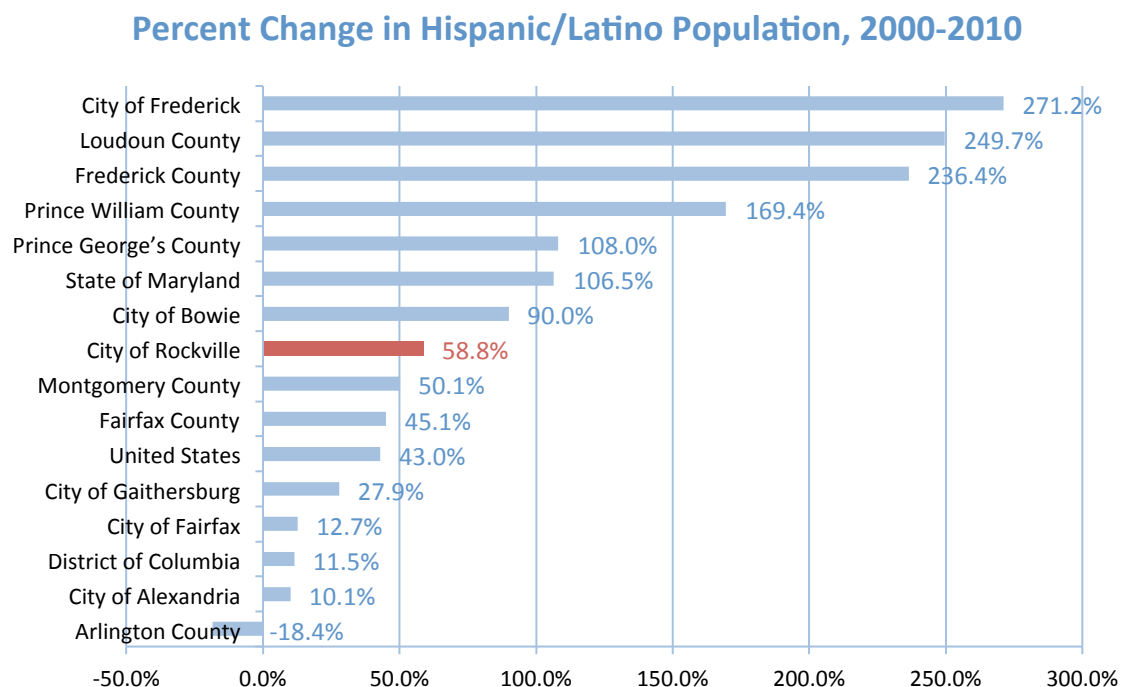
Rockville's 2010 Hispanic or Latino population was 14.3 percent of the population. In 2000, Hispanic or Latino residents made up 11.7 percent.

Country of Origin and place of residence of Hispanic or Latino population in the City.

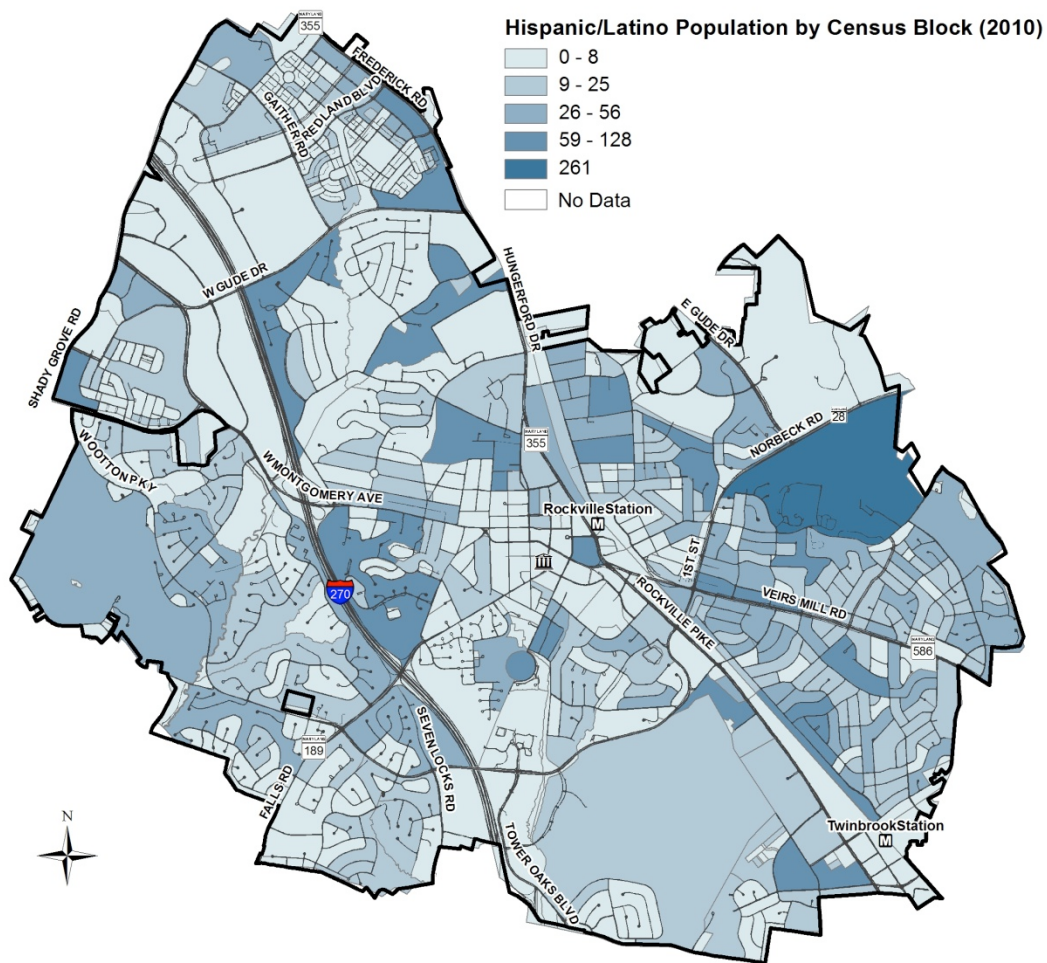

Figure 7: Hispanic/Latino Population by Census Blocks

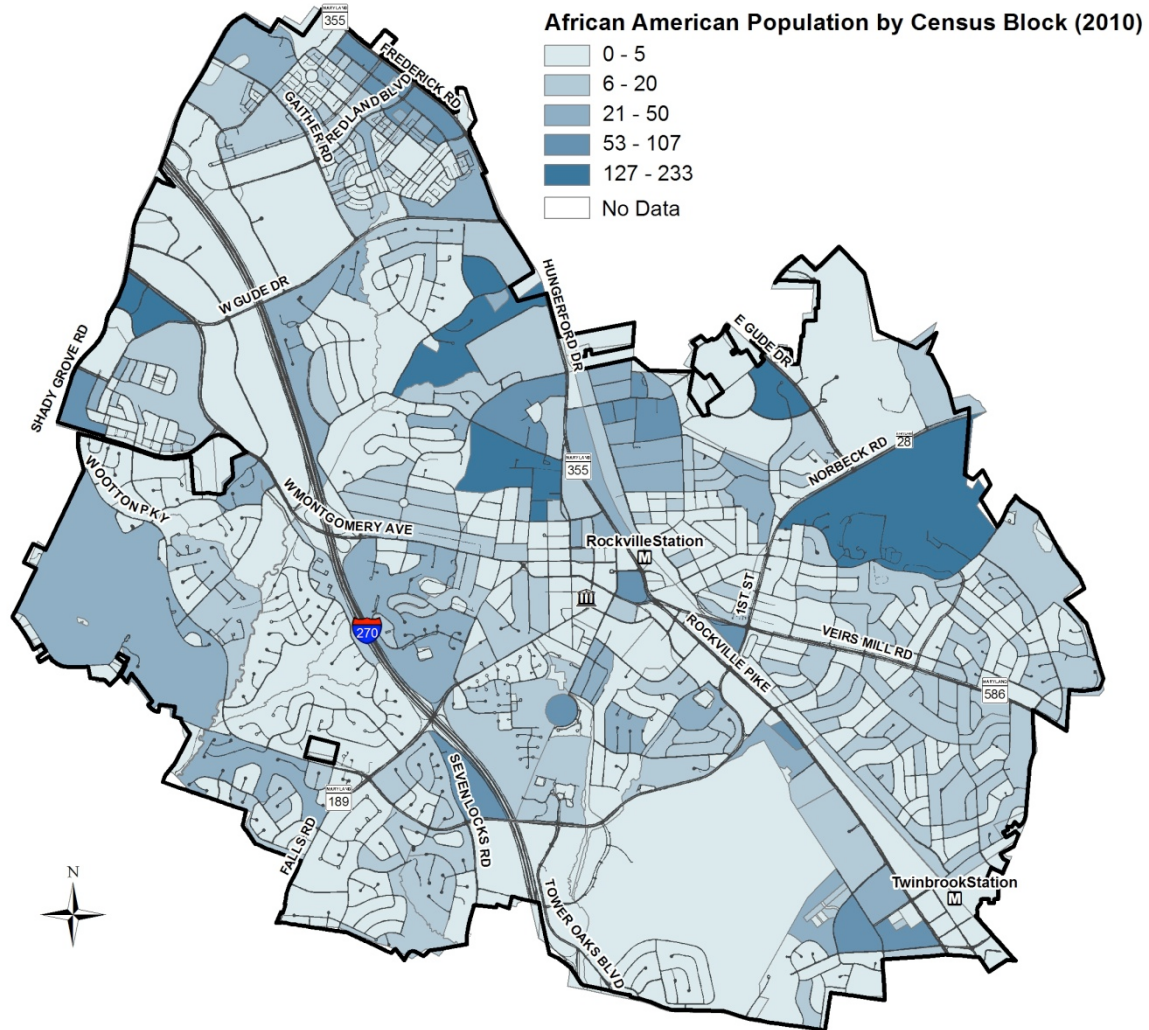

Figure 8 : African American Population by Census Block

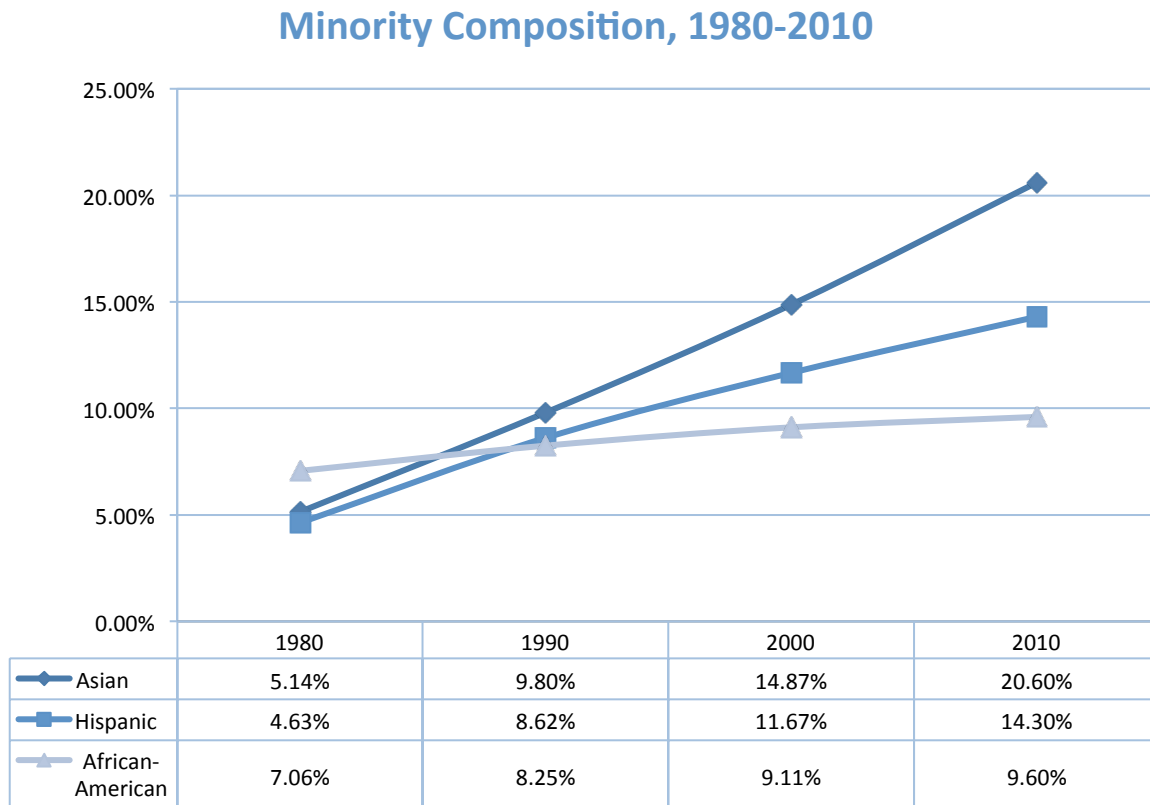

Figure 9 : Growth of Minority Population



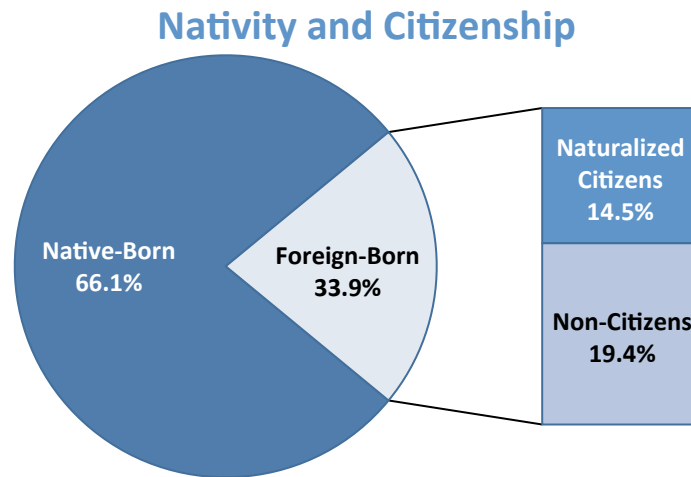

Rockville's Foreign Born Population

Thirty-four percent of the City's 2010 total population was born outside the United States. Out of this foreign-born population, 14.5 percent were U.S. citizens and 19.4 percent were non-citizens.

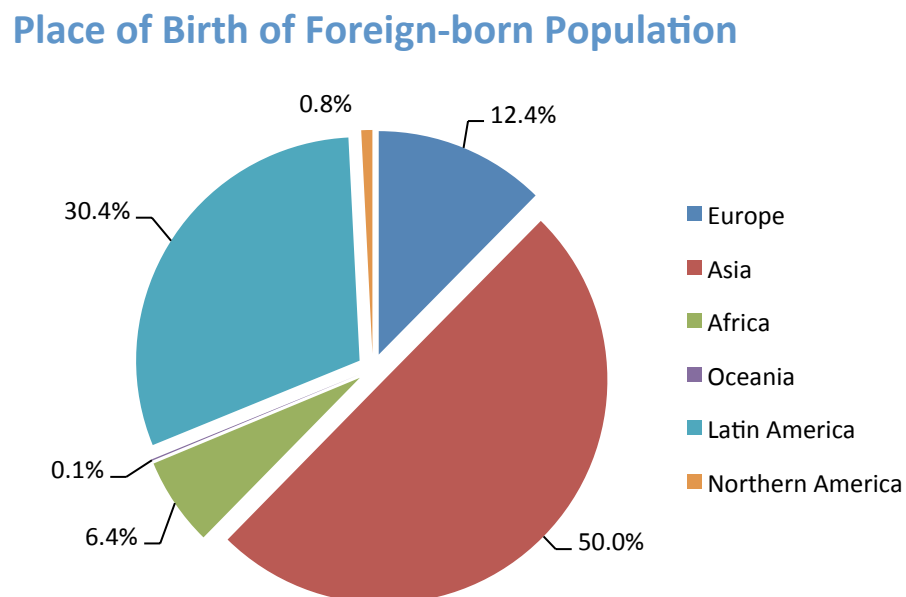
Figure 10: Nativity and Citizenship

Fifty percent of Rockville's foreign-born population was from Asia, followed by 30.4 percent from Latin America. 84.9 percent of the foreign-born population spoke a language other than English at home and 43.4 percent spoke English less than "very well".

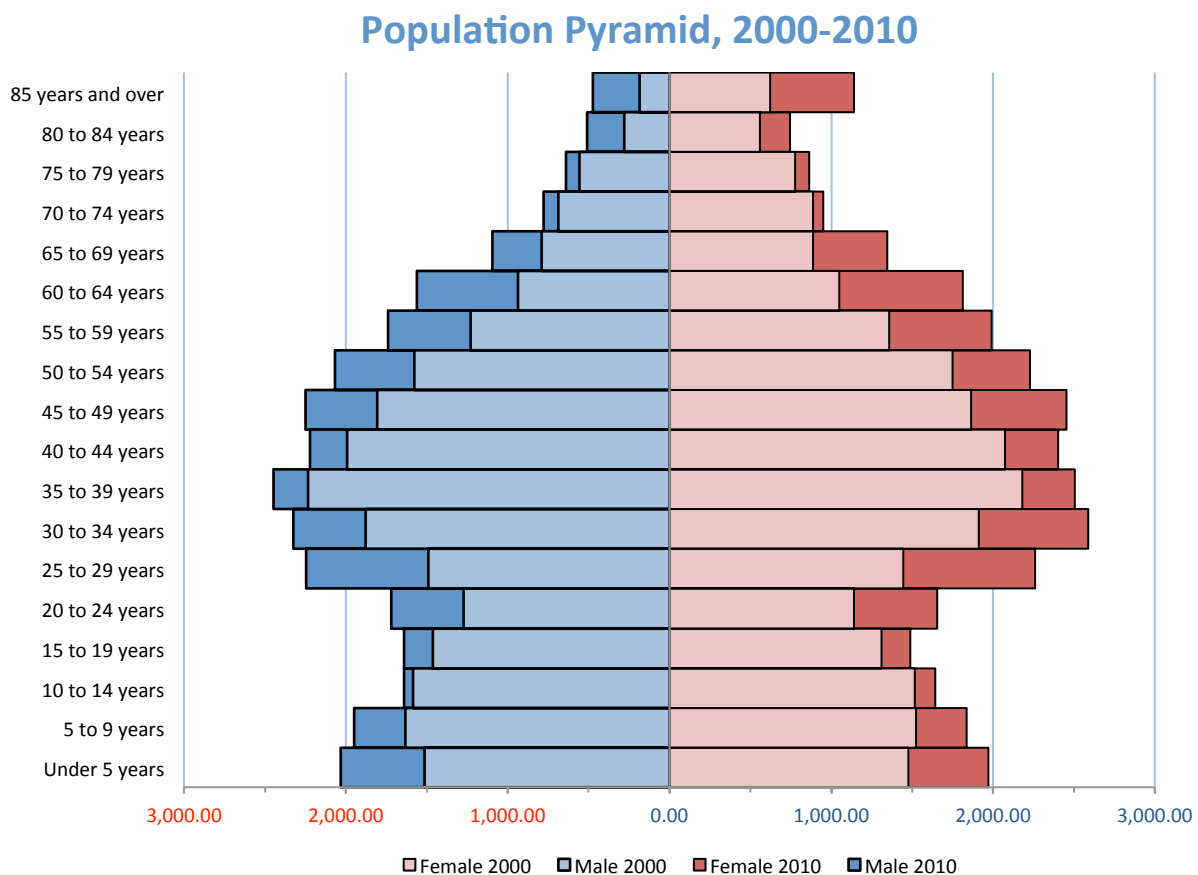
Age and Sex

Age and Sex Distribution in the City of Rockville

Population increased in all age-cohort categories from 2000 to 2010. Women outnumber men, 31,869 to 29,350, respectively, in Rockville, especially in the 85+ age category.

- In 2000, Rockville's resident's median age was 37.8. In 2010, it was 38.7.
- In 2000, 1.7% of the City's population was ages 85 and over, and this category had increased by 2.6% in 2010. The 65 years of age or older age group was 13.1% in 2000; this group had increased slightly to 14 % by 2010.
- About one-third of the city residents (33% in 2010 and 30% in 2000) were 50 years of age or older.
- In 2000, the under 5 years of age population was 6.1%, which increased slightly to 6.5% by 2010. The under 9 years of age population was 12.9% in 2000 and 12.7% in 2010.
- The under 18 segment of the population stayed relatively stable. (23.3 % in 2000 and 23.2 % in 2010).

Figure 12: Population Pyramid, 2000-2010



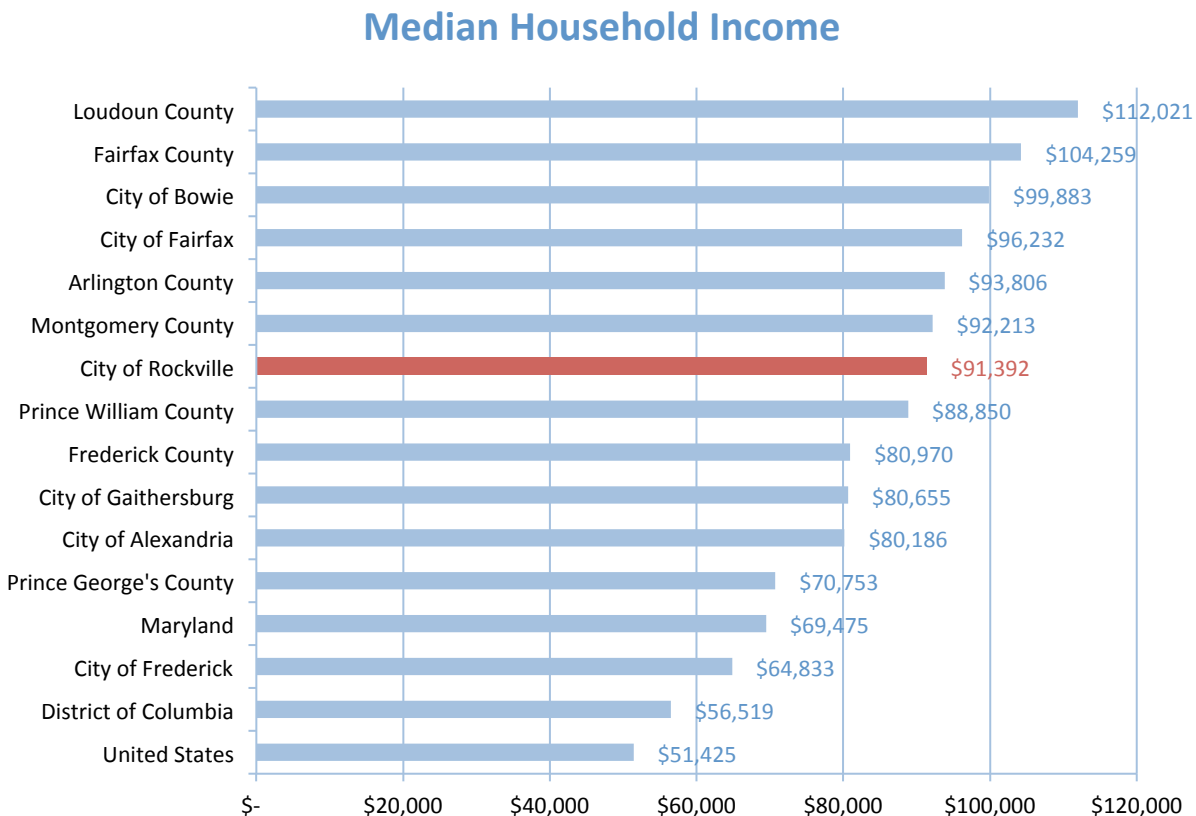

Income and Poverty

Household Income

According to the 2005-2009 American Community Survey results, Rockville's median household income of \$91,392 was 77 percent higher than the national average, 31 percent higher than Maryland, and similar to that of Montgomery County. Two DC area jurisdictions, Loudoun County and Fairfax County, had median household incomes exceeding \$100,000.

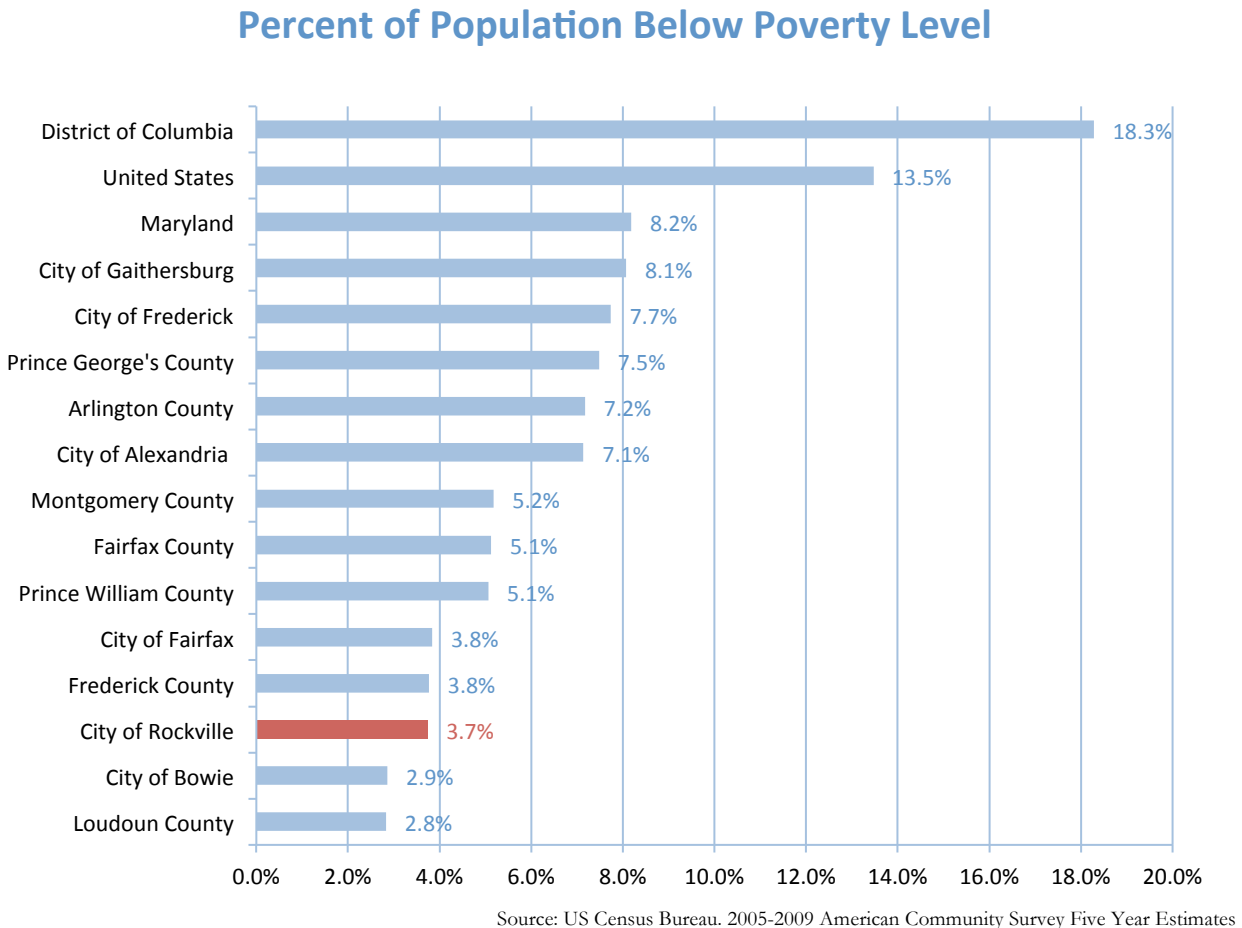

Poverty

Rockville's poverty rate¹ as reported by the 2005-2009 ACS was 3.7 percent, among the lowest in the region. The majority of jurisdictions in the Washington region have poverty rates lower than the national average.

Household, Housing and Families characteristics

Housing characteristics

In 2010, there were a total of 25,199 housing units in Rockville, of which 23,686 or 94 percent were occupied.

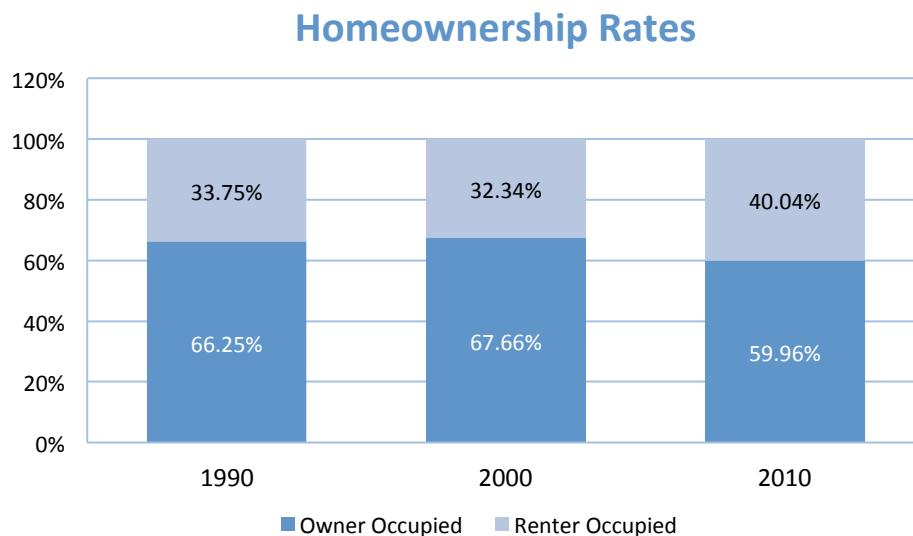

Out of the occupied housing units, 11,281 (47.6%) were owned through a mortgage or loan; 2,921 (12.3%) were owned “free and clear”; and 9,484 (40%) were renter-occupied.

Homeownership rates dropped substantially in Rockville from 1990 to 2000. In 2010, out of the total occupied housing units, 60 percent were owner-occupied and 40 percent were rentals. Comparatively in 2000, 67 percent were owner-occupied and 32 percent were rentals. The average household size in 2010 for owner-occupied units was 2.69 people per household and for renter-occupied units, 2.32. In 2000, the average household size for owner-occupied unit was 2.71, and renter-occupied was 2.54.

Household Types

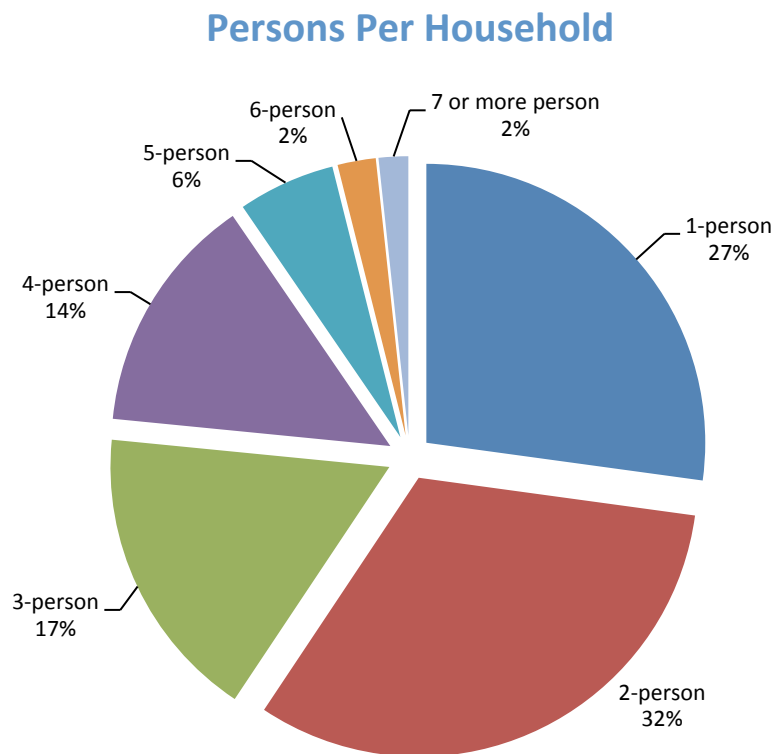
The majority of households in Rockville were in the 1-person and 2-person categories in 2010, which combine to about 59 percent. Three- and four-person households combined were 30.9 percent. The remaining 9.5 percent of households were with 5 or more persons.

Rockville's Average Household Size has declined over the past 60 years

Paralleling the national trend, Rockville's average household size has been declining. At 2.54 per household in 2010, it is significantly less than its size of 3.99 in 1960. In contrast, in the past decade, the household size in Montgomery County increased from 2.66 to 2.70.

More than half of Rockville households do not identify themselves as a family

There were 15,524 families in Rockville in 2010, the majority of which were husband and wife families (12,283 or 79%). The remaining 3,141 families were those with no spouse present. In families with no spouse present, there were 2,364 households headed by women and 795 headed by men.

Area Housing Costs are high for Renters

The Washington region is marked with high incidence (40%) of renter households paying more than 30 percent of their gross incomes on rent which is the standard measure of housing affordability. In Rockville, almost 43 percent of renter-occupied households spend more than 30 percent of their gross income on rent.

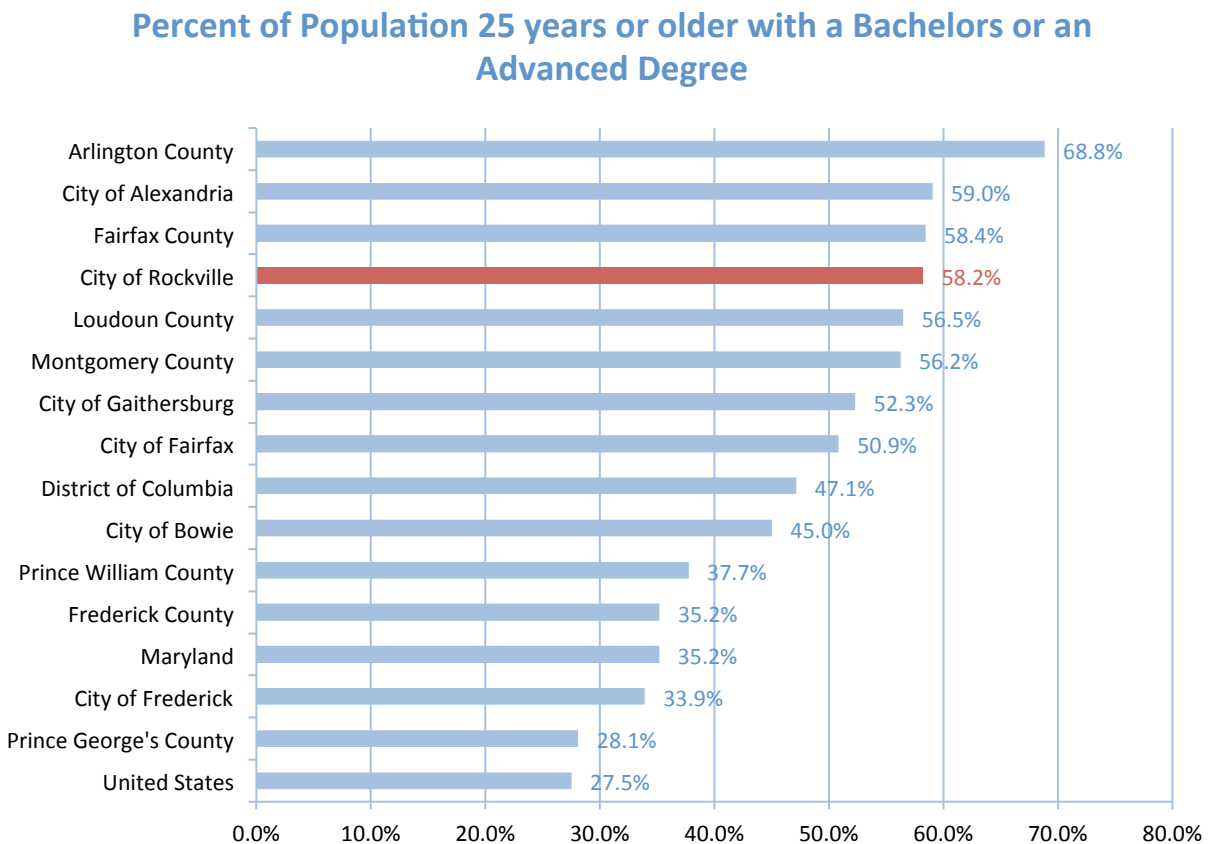

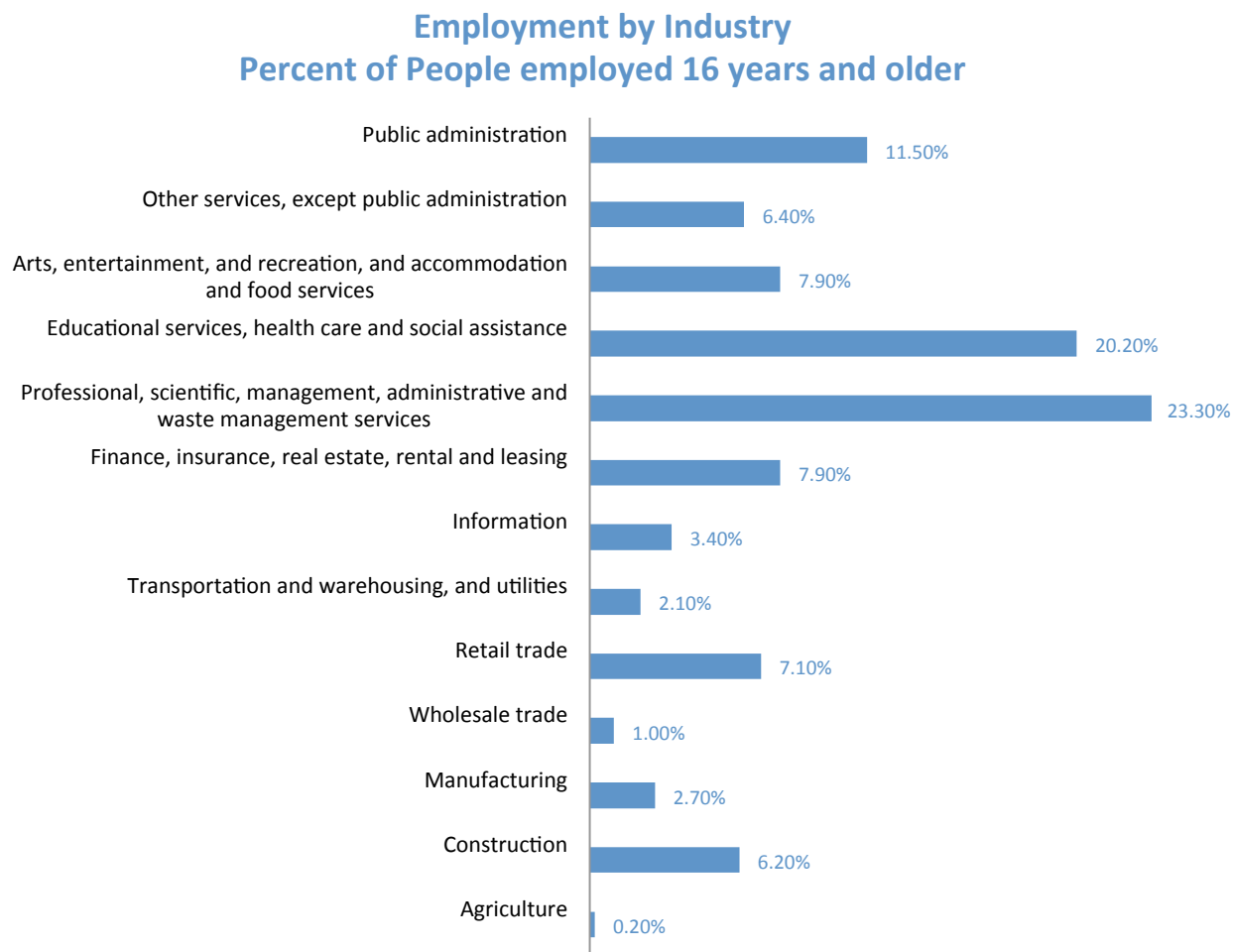

The majority of Rockville's residents are employed in the Professional, Scientific and Technical Services

The following table shows employment of Rockville residents only. More than 71 percent of Rockville's residents, age 16 and older, were in the civilian labor force in 2005-2009. The leading industries of employment were professional, scientific and management services (23.3%), followed by education services and health care (20.2%). Other employment concentrations were found in financial services and government.

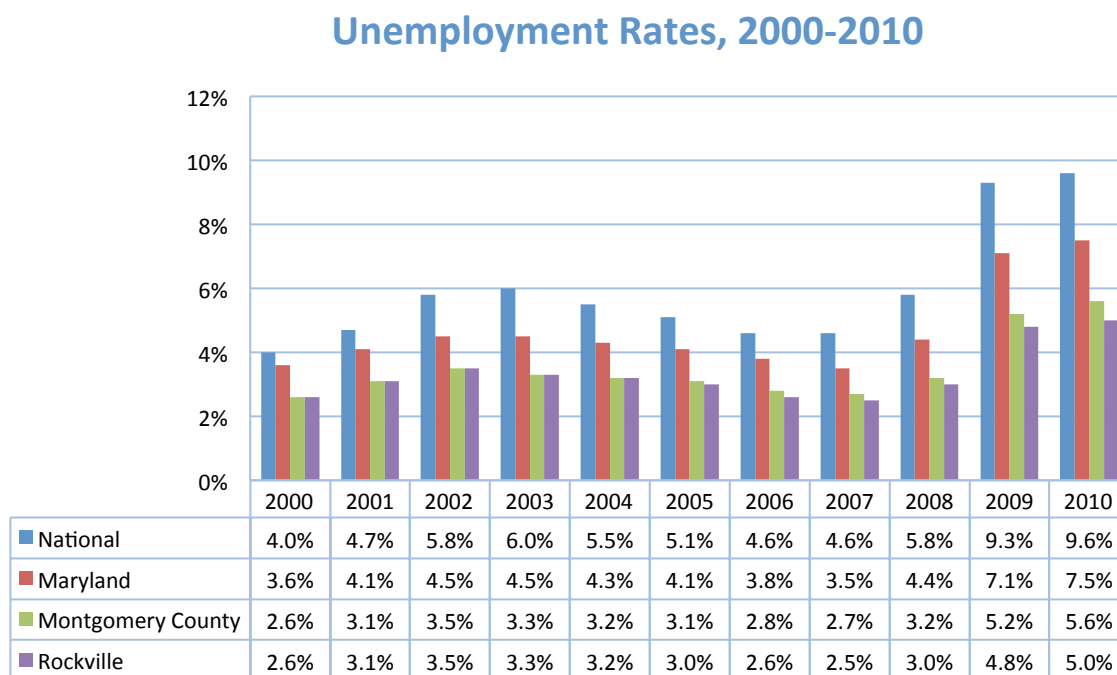

Unemployment rates

Consistent with national trends over the past two years, unemployment in Rockville increased substantially in 2009 and 2010. The estimated unemployment rate for the City of Rockville for the year 2010 was 5%, compared to 5.6% in Montgomery County, 7.5% in Maryland and 9.6% for the nation. From 2005 to 2010, Rockville's unemployment rate has been slightly lower than Montgomery County.

Preliminary unemployment figures for the second half of 2011 (shown below) indicate lower rates for the City of Rockville and Montgomery County as compared to 2010. Unemployment figures do not include many part-time workers and those who are not in the labor force.

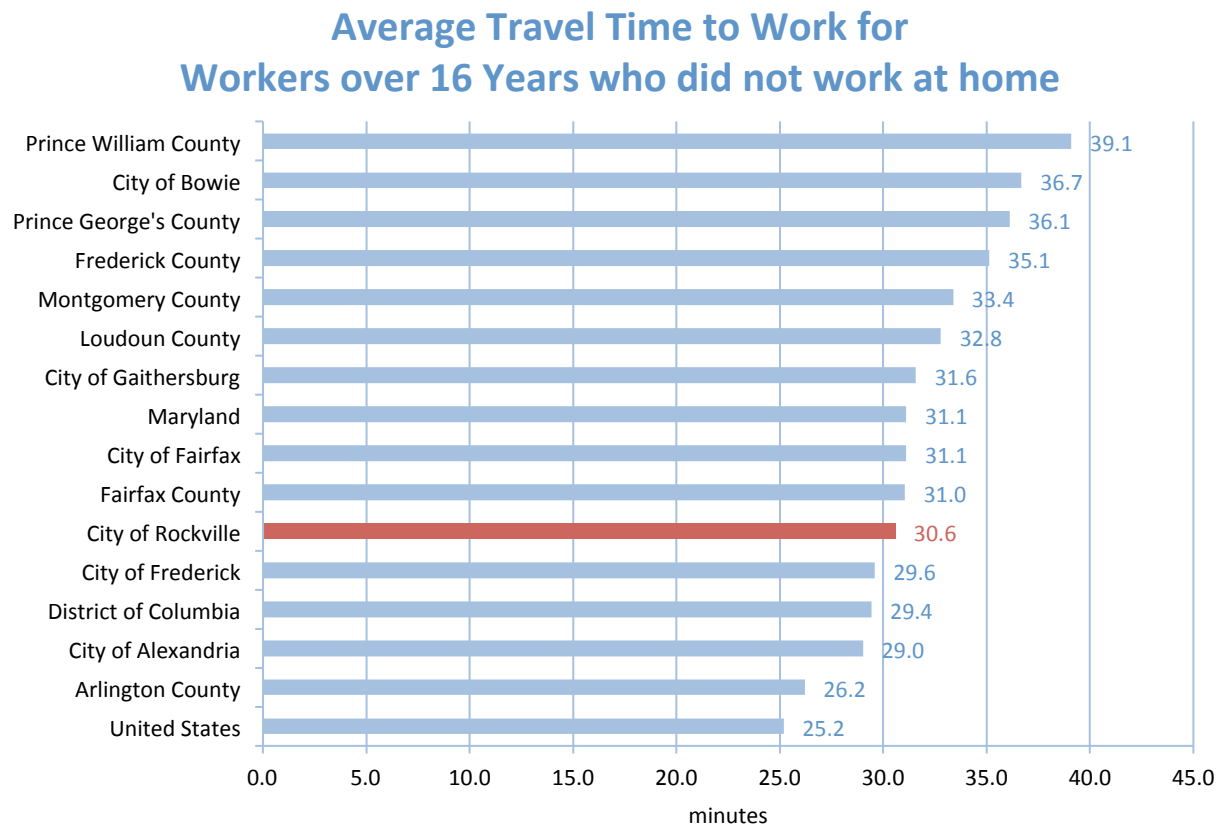

Commuting Patterns

Travel time and Means of Transportation

Average travel times to work throughout the Washington region exceeded the United States average between 2005 and 2009, with the majority of jurisdictions having average travel times of 30 minutes or more. Rockville workers average commute time was 30.6 minutes, on average, between 2005 and 2009.

Figure 20: Commute Times



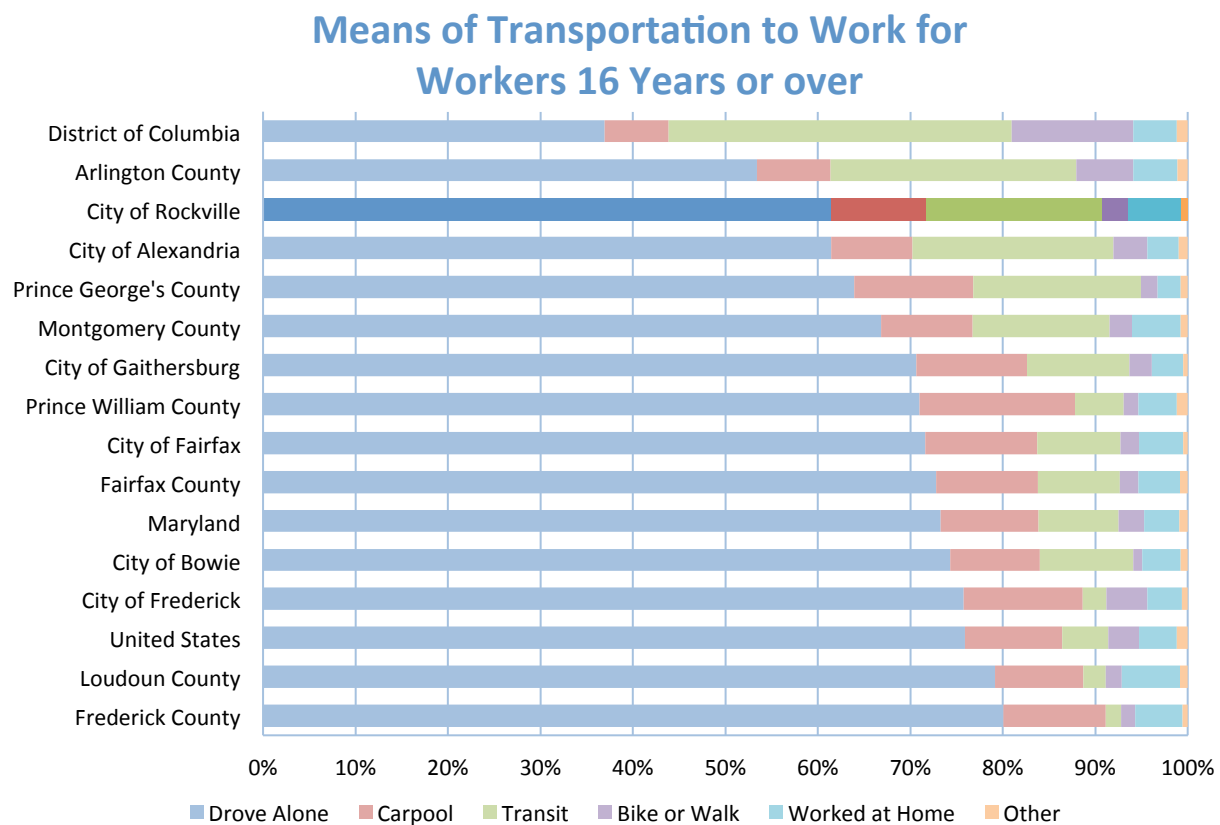

Approximately 60% of Rockville Residents Commute to Work by Driving Alone

In the City of Rockville 61.4 percent of workers commuted by auto alone, 10.3 percent carpooled, 19.1 percent took transit, 2.8 percent biked or walked to work and 5.7 percent telecommuted. Among those that commuted to work, it took them on average 30.6 minutes to get to work.

There was a wide variation in modal split across the jurisdictions. The District of Columbia had the lowest percentage of workers driving alone (37 percent) and a roughly equal percentage of workers using transit. In jurisdictions with suburban and exurban development patterns, travel mode splits were similar to those at the national level.
