Watershed Stewardship


- Adopted Maryvale stream
- 2025: 1 cleanup, 25 bags of trash;
 - 2 cleanups planned this fall (9/21, 10-12pm, Dogwood park & 10/12, 10-12pm, Maryvale)
- 2024: 4 cleanups, 41 bags of trash
- Included Watershed Education Displays
- Engaged with local community (Rock Creek Conservancy, Friends of Cabin John)
- Ongoing salt testing program





Citizen Science – Salt Monitoring

- ❖The Environment Commission sponsors the Watershed Committee's initiative to conduct salt monitoring in Rockville streams
- Monitoring 9 locations in the three watersheds in Rockville: Rock Creek, Watts Branch, Cabin John
- Conducted in partnership with local watershed groups and Izaak Walton League of America







Citizen Science – Methane Detection Pilot Project

- In 2024 the Environment Commission began piloting use of a methane detector to measure methane or "natural gas" infrastructure leaks at gas caps in sidewalks
- Researched protocols and provided materials
- Washington Gas is notified of any detectable leaks over a certain threshold
- Held 7 events with 21 total participants who tested about 160 caps
- Results are included on a dashboard
