RESOLUTION: To Amend Charter - Senior Citizens Commission (Resolution No. 62-69)

BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF ROCKVILLE, MARYLAND,

That Resolution No. 62-69, adopted by the Mayor and Council of Rockville on November 3, 1969, for the purpose of establishing a Senior Citizens Commission, be and the same is hereby amended so as to provide that the said Commission
shall be composed of seven (7) members, rather than five (5) as originally stated,
four of said members to be appointed initially for 2-year terms, and three of said
members to be appointed initially for 1-year terms.

The Senior Commission shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

- To conduct research into the problems of the senior population in Rockville, and to determine the extent of facilities and services now available to them;
- To propose programs and other methods of dealing with the problems of the elderly, in such fields as education, health and welfare, employment, recreation and housing;
- 3. To investigate such local, state and federal programs that have been established to benefit and assist the elderly, and to find means of applying such programs and benefits to eligible persons in the City of Rockville:
- 4. To fully integrate the senior population into all City activities;
- 5. To make such other recommendations, as appear to be warranted by the investigations and studies conducted by the Commission, for services, facilities, and actions which will generally be of benefit to its senior population;
- 6. To report to the Mayor and Council at least annually on the progress of the Commission's work.
- The Commission members act as liaison to the Clubs to keep them informed of City programs and regulations and help with any problems.
