RESOLUTION: To cause an Advisory Referendum of the City voters to be taken on questions concerning 1) allowing 16 and 17 year olds to vote in City elections; 2) allowing non-citizens to vote in City elections; 3) imposing three year term limits on members of the Mayor and Council; and 4) creating representative districts from which councilmembers would be elected

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF ROCKVILLE,

MARYLAND, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 8-23 of the Rockville City Code, an advisory referendum of the City voters shall be taken on the questions set forth below at the general election to be held on the next Tuesday after the first Monday in November, in 2023:

The following advisory questions are based on recommendation of the Charter Review Commission.

Advisory questions are non-binding. They allow voters to express their preferences, but their outcomes will not result in a change in the law.

If the Rockville City Council makes new laws, they may consider how voters voted on the questions below.

1) Question 1 - Voting Age

Currently, you must be 18 years old to vote.
